New Initiatives/Opportunities:

2019 International Congress on Glass will be held in Boston. This triannual meeting of a very large, international glass organization, will encompass the 2019 GOMD annual meeting. Organization is being led by Richard Brow (Congress President) and John Mauro (Program Chair). Many GOMD members have already been included in the planning and technical content/themes of this meeting.

2019 is the **100**th **Anniversary of GOMD**, thus the push to host the 2019 ICG Congress. We will need to work closely with ACerS to celebrate this milestone.

Action Items for ACerS Board Consideration at October 22, 2016 meeting: n/a

Issues/Concerns:

We experienced some difficulty in the mechanism by which GOMD and ACerS should recognize and celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the Society of Glass Technology (UK). GOMD engaged David Pye to design and create a piece of stained-glass art as a gift to SGT. The division was optimistic that supplemental funds could offset some of the costs incurred by this project, but this is inconsistent with the intent of such funds. Instead, Richard Brow led a fund-raising effort to secure most of the financial support necessary to complete this project.

The continuing issue is how to better recognize international organizations similar to ACerS or GOMD (or any other division) in the future. DGG (Germany) celebrates their centennial in 2022 and we expect to face similar concerns at that time.

Additional Items of Note:

Supplemental division funds from ACerS were requested in support of student engagement in GOMD. We are in the process of using these funds to support international conference participation for up to two undergraduate or graduate students. Targeted conferences are the 100th Society of Glass Technology (UK) meeting in September 2016 and the GOMD/CerSJ International Symposium in November 2016 (Kyoto). The initiative follows closely with the overall goal of providing support for

students in glass science, and is consistent with previous use of division funds to support student attendance at GOMD and MS&T meetings.
